Welcome to Vanuatu

Geography of Vanuatu

The Republic of Vanuatu consists of a 'Y' shaped chain of 68 inhabited islands located in the South West Pacific Ocean. The chain stretches over a distance of approximately 850 kilometres in a north-south direction. The islands lie between 13 and 22 degrees south of the equator and between 166 and 172 degrees east of Greenwich.

Vanuatu is approximately 800 kilometres south-east of the Solomon Islands and about the same distance west of the Fiji Islands. New Caledonia is 400 kilometres away, and Sydney (Australia) 1,750 kilometres away, but in a south westerly direction. Most of the islands are volcanic in origin – there are nine active volcanoes, four of which are submarine.

History

The islands are believed to have been inhabited for at least 3,500 years and possibly much longer. It is however, only in relatively recent years that much mention was made by explorers of the existence of the New Hebrides, the name of the country before Independence in 1980. Captain de Quiros, a Portuguese officer in the service of Spain, was the first to sight the northern part of the islands in 1606. It was not until 1768 that another European, the Frenchman Louis Antoine de Bougainville, visited the islands and recorded the positions of islands of Ambae, Pentecost, and Malekula. A comprehensive map of the positions of the archipelago was drawn up in 1774 by English navigator, Captain James Cook, who named the Group the "New Hebrides" as they reminded him of the Hebrides islands of the British Isles.

"In the following years, the French and British began purchasing the land and played a key role in the country's developing economy. A formal agreement was set in place in 1906 for the New Hebrides to be jointly governed by the British Queen and French President. From 1960s, as the economy grew, Melanesians (Vanuatu indigenous peoples) began claiming their land back from foreign owners.

They became more active in politics, and the dream of gaining independence by the 1980s became reality”- (Jason’s Vanuatu Visitor Map). In 1979, a Melanesian (political) Party took 26 seats in the general election to form a new Government and Anglican Priest Father Dr Walter Hadye Lini, was elected new Prime Minister – now called “the Father of Independence”. Parliament, through Fr Lini’s leadership elected the new Head of State of the Republic of Vanuatu, Mr Ati George Sokomanu – and Vanuatu meaning “my land eternal” was re-born.

Weather/Climate

The climate varies considerably. The north is wetter and more humid than the south. There are two distinct seasons, with the ‘hot’ and ‘rainy’ season from November to April (also known as the cyclone season) and the ‘cool’ and ‘dry’ season from May to October.

The average temperature on the island of Efate, where the capital Port Vila is situated, ranges from 27 degrees Celsius in February to 22 degrees Celsius in July.

People & Culture

Living tribal cultures are part of what makes Vanuatu so special to visit, and Vanuatu is recognized as one of the most culturally diverse countries in the world. Vibrant Melanesian culture and the welcoming smiles and warmth of the people will guarantee you a relaxed and memorable holiday. General Information

Visas & Entry Requirements

You are required to produce a valid passport and return ticket for entry into Vanuatu and must present these to the Immigration authorities upon arrival at the airport, including information on where you will be staying and the nature of your visit.

For stays not exceeding 30 days, bona fide visitors who are nationals of Commonwealth countries, EU countries, Fiji, Japan, Norway, Philippines, South Korea, China, Switzerland and USA do not require a visa. Visas for other nationalities are obtainable from The Immigration Department, Private Mail Bag 9092, Port Vila – extendable up to 4 months (re-issued monthly) email: Mr. Allan Liki, aliki@vanuatu.gov.vu.

Customs Allowances

Duty free into Vanuatu: 1.5 litres of alcohol, 200 cigarettes or 50 cigars or 250gm tobacco, 2 litres wine, 25 cl eau de toilette, 10cl perfume. Plus, other items to the value of VT150,000.

Returning Duty Free Allowances:

Australia: 2.25L spirits or wine, 250 cigarettes or 250g tobacco, A\$900 personal goods (A\$450 per minor).

New Zealand: 1.125L spirits, 4.25L wine or beer, 200 cigarettes or 250g tobacco or 50 cigars, NZ\$700 personal goods (Jason's – Vanuatu Visitor Map)

Accommodation

Please do your own bookings directly with the relevant accommodation of your choice hotel and inform us of your travel itinerary well in advance so that we can arrange airport transfers and hotel transfers to the Venue. B. During the PWA

Banking

- (1) National Bank of Vanuatu (NBV) opening hours – 8.30am to 3.30pm, Monday to Thursday; Friday to 4pm. The NBV Airport Branch is open for all arrivals and departures. There are ATMs in various locations around Port Vila.
- (2) ANZ opening hours – 9am to 3.30pm, Monday to Friday. ANZ has cash dispensers (ATMs) in Port Vila and at the international airport.
- (3) Bank South Pacific (BSP) opening hours – 8.30am to 4pm, Monday to Friday. BSP has ATMs around Port Vila.
- (4) Bred Bank Limited opening hours – 8am to 3pm, Monday to Friday. Bred has ATMs around Port Vila.

Besides there are a number of Money Exchange & Money Transfers available in Port Vila which can facilitate cashing, telegraphic transfers & bank drafts, overseas payments and receive funds on your behalf in different currencies.

Business/Shopping Hours

Business hours are usually 7.30am to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday and Saturday mornings until 12.00 hours. Some shops will close for lunch at 11.30am to 1.30pm but you will find supermarkets, banks and the post office remaining open. Most shops are closed on Sundays – though if a cruise ship is in town Port Vila will be open.

Telecommunications

Fixed and mobile communications are provided in Vanuatu from competing providers. The telecommunications sector is regulated by the Telecommunications and Radio communications Regulator (www.trr.vu) (Tel: +678 27621) (Open from 0730 to 1700 hrs Monday to Friday. First Floor ex Ocean Walk, Lini High Way, Port Vila).

Vanuatu Post offers an EMS service for the delivery of items to overseas destinations at competitive rates. Port Vila Post office offers DHL and Western union money transfer services. Local and international mail and parcel services are available from 60 locations nationwide. The Post has a wide range of post cards, greeting and gift cards, packaging and postal material available.

Post Office boxes are available in most locations; mail is both delivered and collected from your box for onward delivery locally and internationally. Internet kiosks are available at the Vanuatu Post.

The Post Office is open from Monday to Friday 7.30am to 4.30pm for all postage, collector stamps, fax and phone calls. You can order stamps and other collectibles from this website philatelic@vanuatu.vu, call the local office on phone 22000 or email service@vanuatupost.vu

DHL (Vanuatu Freight and logistical services)

Tipping

Neither tipping nor bargaining is culturally acceptable in Vanuatu. If you would like to express thanks for a service, you can perhaps give a t-shirt or souvenir as a gift from your country. It is not expected, but small items are received with much appreciation.

Departure Tax

An international departure tax of VT3,000 is included in the price of your ticket. A provincial departure tax of VT200 on domestic flights is payable at the airports.

Clothing

Light, cool and comfortable. Brief clothing should not be worn in public places. A sweater is a good idea for the evenings during May to September (Jason's – Vanuatu Visitor Map). However, formality is required for PWA Forum.

Currency & Money Transfer

The Vanuatu decimal currency is based on the Vatu (VT). The Vatu currency is linked to a basket of currencies. International and domestic cash transfers are available at Western Union branches, Vanuatu Post and MoneyGram (Goodies, Port Vila).

Exchange Rates

Up to date exchange rates are available from all local banks and money exchanges. Many hotels and accommodation providers will be able to give you the daily rate or rough indication.

Currency

The local currency unit is the Vatu.

EFTPOS

There are currently more than 250 Eftpos outlets around Port Vila that accept the following cards – Visa, MasterCard, Cirrus, Amex, JCB & Plus Card and Access International Debit Card.

Money Exchange

Major credit cards (Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Diners & JCB) are accepted at most major hotels/resorts and some restaurants and shops. Travellers cheques are widely accepted at the major banks and most of the larger resorts and hotels.

Language

Vanuatu has one national language (Bislama or Pidgin English), and two Official Languages (English and French). But you will find French and English being spoken in the streets, shops and offices.

Time

Vanuatu time is GMT plus 11 hours, which is one hour ahead of Australian Eastern Standard time.

Local transport

In Port Vila, look out for small buses (number plates will start with a 'B'). They will take you anywhere within the greater Port Vila area for VT200. The bus runs anywhere convenient to the driver. If you have time it is an interesting way to see Port Vila. Taxi fares are relatively expensive. There is a set price of VT2,000 from the airport to Port Vila hotels. Outside of this, you should agree on a price with your driver before setting out on your journey. Buses and taxis also operate in Luganville on Espiritu Santo.

Taxes (VAT)

There is a 12.5% tax on accommodation, food and most products in Vanuatu, excluding market and local produce (Jason's – Vanuatu Visitor Map).

Health & Medical

Health facilities exist in Port Vila. There are no dangerous animals or insects in Vanuatu. No compulsory vaccinations are required but anti-malarial medicines or [repellent for body spray](#) is recommended, especially for visits to outer islands.

Ambulance emergency medical services is arranged at arrival of Buerfield International Airport - Port Vila and after working hours. [Call emergency phone 112 for immediate medical attendance.](#)
